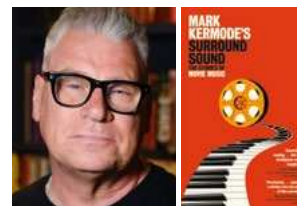
### Menace and Glamour: The Cultural Influence of the Du Mauriers
